

Shooting Stars Tips for: Strings Auditions

BE PROFESSIONAL

Keep up-to-date with your calendar.

Prepare and submit all materials on time.

Plan and prepare repertoire with your nominating teacher and/or private instructor

Use this opportunity to help you prepare for college auditions if you are planning on majoring in instrumental music.

LOOK PROFESSIONAL

Dress for the occasion. Remember: you want the judges to think about you, not about your clothes.

- plan audition clothing well in advance.

practice in your clothing, especially shoes for gals and coat and shoes for guys.make sure all clothing fits well and is cleaned and pressed! You want to be comfortable yet professional. Don't wear revealing clothes or shoes, which definitely means no flip flops!

- coordinate accessories: jewelry, shoes, neckties, etc.

- Options to consider: suit or coat, necktie or not, please, no t-shirts. Also consider either a dress or pants and a nice blouse, height of heels, length of skirt, hair style (it's important that your hair is out of your
- Frame yourself in the video to be seen from the feet up (whole body within frame)

ACT PROFESSIONAL

When you introduce yourself also introduce the selections you will perform and the composers. Also introduce your accompanist (if you have one.)

Show confidence and enthusiasm, but not arrogance.

Tune instrument before starting to play.

- Present yourself professionally. Judges not only consider your technical ability (playing/performing all the notes), but also your musicianship (how you play/perform, and how you play/perform with your accompanist).
- You may reshoot your video as many times as you want until you feel that it is right.

SOUND PROFESSIONAL

Maintain a regular daily practice schedule.

Choice of material – your selections should: - be age and technical ability appropriate

- be material that moves you; shows your heart and strengths

- show your flexibility, i.e. contrasting pieces by two different composers
- meet all criteria of the Shooting Stars Scholarship Guidelines

Study scores with care; strive for no rhythm or note mistakes

Work to infuse the music with feeling and purpose; communicate and tell the story

- Remember, most of you will be standing for your audition practice standing and holding your instrument
- If using an accompanist, arrange for one now to make sure they are available. Be sure to practice with your accompanist well in advance of your audition.

Practice in front of a mirror.

Arrange for a practice audition - at home, at school, etc. - with nominating teacher, private instructor and/or parents available to provide feedback/critique.
