

Shooting Stars Tips for: Theatre Performance Auditions

) BE PROFESSIONAL

Keep up-to-date with your calendar.

Prepare and submit all materials on time.

Plan and prepare repertoire with your nominating teacher and/or private instructor

 Use this opportunity to help you prepare for college auditions if you are planning on majoring in theatre and/or music.

LOOK PROFESSIONAL

Dress for the occasion. Remember: you want the judges to think about you, not about your clothes.

- plan audition clothing well in advance.

- practice in your clothing, especially shoes for gals and coat and shoes for guys.

- make sure all clothing fits well and is cleaned and pressed! You want to be comfortable yet professional. Don't wear revealing clothes or shoes, which definitely means no flip flops!

- coordinate accessories: jewelry, shoes, neckties, etc.

- Options to consider: suit or coat, necktie or not, please, no t-shirts. Also consider either a dress or pants and a nice blouse, height of heels, length of skirt, hair style (it's important that your hair is out of your eyes!).
- Frame yourself in the video to be seen from the feet up (whole body within frame)

3) ACT PROFESSIONAL

 When you introduce yourself, also introduce the selections you will perform and the playwrights and/or composers.

Show confidence and enthusiasm, but not arrogance.

• Present yourself professionally. Judges not only consider your technical ability (singing/performing all the notes/words), but also your musicianship (how you sing/perform, and how you sing/perform with your accompanist).

• If you make a mistake, don't show it! Keep singing/performing. Judges aren't necessarily looking for perfection as much as they are looking for potential.

4) SOUND PROFESSIONAL

- Maintain a regular daily practice schedule.
- Your choice of material should:

- be age appropriate

- be material that moves you; shows your heart and strengths

- show your flexibility and range, i.e. contrasting pieces by two different composers

- be from a published, reputable play/musical

- monologues must be from a play; be sure to read the entire play so you understand the monologue and its context within the play
- with a monologue, you are performing a character but be sure to show your intelligence and emotion

- meet all criteria of the Shooting Stars Scholarship Guidelines

- Study monologue and/or scores with care; strive for no rhythm, note or word mistakes.
- Work to infuse the music and words with feeling and purpose. Communicate and tell the story.

Practice in front of a mirror.

- Practice with your accompanist (if using one). Arrange for accompanist now to make sure they are available for the day of the audition.
- Arrange for a practice audition at home, at school, etc. with your nominating teacher, private instructor and/or parents available to provide feedback/critique.
