



Photography Scholarship Guidelines

PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

Finalist must submit Portfolio using online Submission Form for review by arts professionals for scholarship and Nerman Museum Exhibition consideration by Friday, January 14, 2022. Also, finalist must attend a Filmed Introduction Day at Tico Productions on either February 8th or 9th, 2022.

Photography Portfolio consists of Submission Form, Artwork Information and Digital Images of Finalist's chosen Photography Artworks, and Confirmation of Filmed Introduction Attendance.

Photography artworks must be on flat surfaces and are defined as artwork created by the Finalist, including computer generated works, in the following categories: painting, drawing, graphic design, mixed media.

Examples of Photography medium include: 35mm, digital etc.

Submitted artworks must have been created within your four high school years, 2018-2022.

Finalist must provide Artwork Information and a Digital Image for five (5) artworks:

- All five artworks will be eligible for Scholarship consideration
 - Only three of the five artworks will be eligible for Nerman Museum Exhibition consideration. Nerman Museum Staff will select one artwork from each Finalist for the Exhibition
 - Artworks for "Exhibition and Scholarship consideration" must meet specific size restrictions - see next page
- Note: Failure to meet size restrictions will result in disqualification from the Shooting Stars Program

STEPS TO CREATING AND SUBMITTING ARTWORK

- Before creating/selecting artwork, carefully review and discuss Photography Scholarship Guidelines, Scoring Rubric and Tips for Portfolio Preparation with nominating teacher
- Select five artworks, then identify which three of the five artworks you want the Nerman Museum to consider for the Shooting Stars Exhibition (the three pieces must meet special size restrictions)
- Create/Produce one digital image that best represents each piece of artwork to include in the Digital Image Portfolio; make sure size and digital image file name of each artwork meets specifications (see next page).
- Digital images may be edited in order to represent the clearest, most accurate and best representation of Finalist's artwork and to ensure that images meet the requirements of the Scholarship Guidelines
- Consult with nominating teacher and/or review Tips for Portfolio Preparation (from Prep Workshop) for help creating digital image for each artwork
- The digital image file name (for each artwork) must be the same as the Title of the Artwork
- Complete Photography Submission Form, making sure artwork images are entered/uploaded in the correct section of the Form (images considered for Nerman Museum Exhibition and Scholarship vs. Scholarship only)
- Do not leave any boxes/choices empty on the Submission Form or submission will be rejected

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- 1) Finalist must meet all Participation Requirements (as stated in the Finalist Program Packet) and comply with Photography Scholarship Guidelines.
- 2) Finalist is solely responsible for meeting all Shooting Stars Scholarship Program Due Dates i.e. Prep Workshop, Résumé Submission, Portfolio Submission, Filmed Introduction.
Note: Finalists receive one email reminder from ACJC approximately one week prior to each Due Date.
- 3) Late or incomplete submissions or failure to meet all Participation Requirements, Scholarship Guidelines or Nerman Museum Exhibition Requirements will result in immediate disqualification from the Shooting Stars Scholarship Program.

NERMAN MUSEUM EXHIBITION

Finalist or parent/guardian must deliver the Finalist's selected artwork to the Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art on either March 3 or 4, 2022 (tentative dates) and sign Exhibition Museum Loan Form while at the Museum. Parent signature is required if Finalist is not 18.

Finalist is required or Finalist's parent is required to pick up Exhibition artwork from the Nerman Museum when notified of its availability after the Exhibition closes (first part of May 2022). The Arts Council of Johnson County will not be responsible for unclaimed artwork.

Visual Arts: Photography Scholarship Guidelines

Artwork Information and Images for the 5 artworks are divided into two sections.

SECTION ONE

Artworks for Nerman Exhibition and Scholarship consideration (3 artworks)

- One image of each artwork (three images total – artwork #1 through #3) to be considered for both scholarship and exhibition at the internationally renowned Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art
- Selected Artworks should demonstrate highest level of Photography design accomplishment and meet size requirements for the Exhibition
- The Nerman Museum staff considers quality, mastery of media, significance of content, size, and how the artworks will relate to one another and create a coherent whole in the Exhibition space when selecting the Finalists' artwork for the Exhibition.
- Artwork size: may not exceed 24" x 18" x 1" – restrictions are due to limited gallery space and number of Visual Art Finalists participating in the Exhibition.
- Artwork size in Submission Form means the size of the physical artwork or printed photograph that will be included in the Exhibition (DOES NOT mean the size of the artwork on your computer screen).
- The Nerman Museum will mount and frame all selected artwork for the Exhibition.
- All three (3) artworks must be available for Exhibition from February – May 2022; Finalists notified in mid-to-late February about artwork to late February about artwork chosen for the Exhibition.
- To assist with the judging process, each submitted artwork must have a title.
- Name of each image file (for Portfolio) must be the same as the Title of the Artwork plus Artwork #
 - Example File Title: #1_Title_LastName, #2_Title_LastName
- Submitted images must be:
 - JPG or .ZIP format
 - 90-120 DPI
 - 8MB or less in size
- Finalist must sign a Museum Loan Form in order to exhibit their artwork at the Nerman Museum. (Form is available when artwork is dropped off; Parent signature is required if Finalist is not 18.)
- Failure to meet size restrictions or availability will result in disqualification from the Program

SECTION TWO

Artworks for scholarship consideration only (2 artworks)

- One image of each artwork (two images total – artwork #4 & #5) to be considered for scholarship only
- The Artwork should demonstrate Finalist's understanding of the principles and elements of 2D Art design as well as originality, creativity and versatility of medium.
- Artwork Size: may be any size
- Submitted images must be:
 - .JPG or .ZIP format
 - 90-120 DPI
 - 8MB or less in size
- To assist with the judging process, each submitted artwork must have a title
- Name of each image file (for Portfolio) must be the same as the Title of the Artwork plus Artwork #
 - Example File Title: #1_Title_LastName, #2_Title_LastName

SUBMISSION FORM ARTWORK INFORMATION CHECKLIST

Input the following required information for all 5 submitted artworks

- Artwork Title
- Medium used to create Artwork (i.e. film vs. digital, size of original capture (35mm, medium format, large format)
- Artwork: in inches; (actual size of artwork to take to the Nerman Museum for Exhibition); be accurate. Size is considered in the Nerman selection process and used to determine Exhibition wall space.
- Date Created: during last four school years (2018-2022)
- Artwork Statement: in first person, describe why you made the piece, what it means to you, and how you made it (in particular, what makes the work unique to you); keep it brief – no more than two paragraphs (300 words or less).
