Health and Safety Guidelines + Self Screening

Masks Required

We care about your safety and those around you. Following CDC guidance and Johnson County public health recommendations, ACJC is requiring masks during the entirety of the Gala and Reception.

Additional Safety Measures

To help us host a safe in person Shooting Stars Gala please review and follow the additional recommendations below from the CDC and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment

- Stay home when you are sick. Perform the daily wellness self-check before coming to the Gala
- Follow CDC Guidance for social distancing and facial coverings
- Wash your hands frequently
- Cover your mouth when coughing or sneezing
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily -- including phones, keyboards, doorknobs, handles and light switches.

Wellness Self Check

Gala attendees, finalists, volunteers, and staff are encouraged to complete the Wellness Self Check before coming to Shooting Stars Audition Day at the Bell Center.

- 1. Have you been told to quarantine/isolate by a medical provider or the health department?
- 2. In the last 14 days, have you had face-to-face contact for 15 minutes or more with someone who has or is suspected of having COVID-19?
- 3. In the last 14 days, have you traveled to a location with a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or Kansas COVID-19 travel warning?
- 4. Are you experiencing a new cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- 5. In the last 48 hours, have you had at least two of the following new symptoms:
- Fever of 100.4 or above

- Chills
- Repeated shaking with chills
- Muscle pain
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Loss of sense of taste or smell
- 6. Was your temperature 100.4 or above this morning?

If your answer to any of the screening questions above is yes, please do not attend Audition Day.
