

Three-Dimensional Art Scholarship Guidelines

PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

Finalist must submit Portfolio using online Submission Form for review by arts professionals for scholarship and Nerman Museum Exhibition consideration by Wednesday, January 10, 2024.

1. 3D Art Portfolio consists of Submission Form, Artwork Information and Digital Images of Finalist's chosen 3D Artworks, and Confirmation of Filmed Introduction Attendance.

2. 3D artworks are defined as artwork created by the Finalists in the following categories using materials including, **but not limited to**, ceramics, glass, jewelry, metal-smithing, and textile and fiber design.

3. Submitted artworks must have been created during the past four school years (2020 and 2024) within your Freshman and Senior years.

4. Finalist must provide Artwork Information and two Digital Images for eight (8) artworks:

- All eight artworks will be eligible for Scholarship consideration
- Only five of the eight artworks will be eligible for Nerman Museum Exhibition consideration. Nerman Museum Staff will select one artwork from each Finalist for the Exhibition
- Artworks for "Exhibition and Scholarship consideration" must meet specific size restrictions – see next page

Note: Failure to meet size restrictions will result in disqualification from the Shooting Stars Program

STEPS TO CREATING AND SUBMITTING ARTWORK

Before creating/selecting artwork, carefully review and discuss the 3D Art Scholarship Guidelines, Scoring Rubric and Tips for Portfolio Preparation with nominating teacher

- Select eight artworks, then identify which five of the eight that you want the Nerman Museum to consider for the Shooting Stars Exhibition (the three must meet special size restrictions)
- Create/Produce two digital images for each piece of artwork that best represent each piece of artwork to include in the Digital Image Portfolio; make sure size and digital image file name of each artwork meets specifications (as listed below)
- Digital images may be edited in order to represent the clearest, most accurate and best representation of Finalist's artwork and to ensure that images meet the requirements of the Scholarship Guidelines
- Consult with nominating teacher and/or review Tips for Portfolio Preparation for help creating digital images for each artwork
- The image file name for each artwork must be the same as the Title of the Artwork
 Evample File Title: #1 Title LastName #2 Title LastName
 - Example File Title: #1_Title_LastName, #2_Title_LastName
- Complete 3D Art Submission Form, making sure artwork images are entered/uploaded in the correct section of the Form (images considered for Nerman Museum Exhibition and Scholarship vs. Scholarship only)
 - Do not leave any boxes/choices empty on the Submission Form or submission will be rejected

NERMAN MUSEUM EXHIBITION

Finalist or parent/guardian must deliver the Finalist's selected artwork to the Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art on either March 7 or 8, 2024 (tentative dates) and sign Exhibition Museum Loan Form while at the Museum. Parent signature is required if Finalist is not 18.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

, Finalist must meet all

 Participation Requirements
 (as stated in the Finalist Program Packet) and comply with Literature Performance Scholarship Guidelines.

Finalist is solely responsible for meeting all Shooting Stars

 Scholarship Program Due Dates, i.e. Orientation, Résumé Submission, Audition.
 Note: Finalist will receive email reminders from ACJC approximately one week prior to each Due Date.

Late or incomplete submissions or failure to meet all

 A) Distribute to meet all Participation Requirements or Scholarship Guidelines will result in immediate disqualification from the Shooting Stars Scholarship Program.

Visual Arts: Three-Dimensional Art Scholarship Guidelines

Artwork Information and Images for the 8 artworks are divided into two sections.

SECTION ONE

Artworks for Nerman Exhibition and Scholarship consideration (5 artworks)

- Two images per artwork (10 images total artwork #1 • through #5) to be considered for both scholarship and exhibition at the internationally renowned Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art
- Selected Artworks should demonstrate highest level of 3D design accomplishment and meet size requirements for the exhibition
- The Nerman Museum staff considers quality, mastery of media, significance of content, size, and how the artworks will relate to one another and create a coherent whole in the Exhibition space when selecting Finalists' artwork for the Exhibition.
- Artwork size may not exceed 18"H x 10"W x 10D" restrictions are due to limited gallery space and number of Visual Art Finalists participating in the Exhibition.
 - Artwork size in Submission Form means size of unframed physical artwork or printed photograph to be included in Nerman Exhibition (DOES NOT mean the size of the artwork on your computer screen)
- The Nerman Museum will mount and frame all selected artwork for the Exhibition.
- All five (5) artworks must be available for Exhibition from February - May 2024; Finalists will be notified in mid to late February about artwork chosen for the Exhibition.
- To assist with the judging process, each submitted artwork must have a title.
- Name of each image file must be the same as the Title of the Artwork plus Artwork # followed by 'A' or 'B' Example - Images for Artwork Labeled #1A_Title_LastŇame, #1B_Title_LastName.
- Submitted images must be:
 - .JPG or .Zip format
 - 72-120 DPI
 - 8MB or less in size
- Finalist must sign a Museum Loan Form in order to exhibit their artwork at the Nerman Museum. (Form is available when artwork is dropped off; Parent signature is required if Finalist is not 18.)
 - Failure to meet size restrictions or availability will result in disgualification from the Program

SECTION TWO

Artworks for scholarship consideration only (3 artworks)

- Two images per artwork (six images total artwork) #6 through #8) to be considered for scholarship only.
- Artworks should demonstrate Finalist's understanding of the principles and elements of 3D Art design as well as originality, creativity and versatility of medium
- Artwork Size: may be any size
- Submitted images must be:
 - .JPEG (.jpg) or .Zip format
 72-120 DPI

 - 8MB or less in size
- To assist with the judging process, each submitted artwork must have a title
- Name of each image file must be the same as the Title of the Artwork plus Artwork # followed by 'A' or 'B'
 - 0 Example File Title: #1A_Title_LastName, #1B_Title_LastName

ARTWORK SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

Input the following required information for all 8 submitted artworks

Artwork Title

Type of Medium: i.e. paint (oil, acrylic & watercolor), silverpoint, graphite, charcoal, chalk, pastels, ink, mixed media, etc.

Artwork: in inches; (actual size of artwork you to take to the Nerman Museum for Éxhibition); be accurate. Size is considered in the Nerman selection process and used to determine Exhibition wall space.

Date Created: during last four school years (July 2020-2024)

Artwork Statement: in first person, describe why you made the piece, what it means to you, and how you made it (in particular, what makes the work unique to you); keep it brief – no more than two paragraphs (300 words or less).
